FLEET CAPTAINS REPORT



The wraps are coming off of the boats and already launching dates are being set.

The travel lift is ready for service and the hoists on the small boat cranes have been checked and are in good condition.

The South fence is being fitted with barbed wire on angled extensions which, when completed, will add to security.

In the interest of safety power cords used for sanders, drills, heaters, during refitting should be disconnected when you leave the boat for any length of time.

Boat cradles should be marked with owners name, preferably on both sides. This will help the yard force when cradles are stored and, in the fall, when locating the cradles for hauling boats.

Old crankcase oil, scrap lumber and other waste materials that result from repairs and readying the boats should be disposed of currently. Trash bins will be placed near the work areas.

The club roadways need considerable work which will be scheduled starting in late April. There may be minor inconveniences during this time and we ask for your patience until the work is finished.

Traffic control signs will be repaired or installed and, in the interest of safety and courtesy, the signs must be heeded.

Members using the launching ramp and the small boat hoists should, as soon as possible, move their vehicle and trailer to the parking areas.


Again, a lot of work is scheduled, hopefully to be done before the season gets into full swing. If anyone has any suggestion on repairs or improvements please let us know about them.
