
PETE GORNY

PATRICK GEARY



JIM LOCKWOOD


I am running for the bridge position of Fleet Captain, and for those of you that do not know me, I will try to give you a brief rundown of my Erie Yacht Club and business history.


CANDIDATE FOR BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Fellow members,


I am honored to be nominated for a position on the Board of Directors of the Erie Yacht Club and I would like the opportunity to highlight some of my background qualifications.
