SEASONAL REMINDERS

- All members who have not filed a slip application for a dry sail boat must do so before bringing your boat on the property. Place your 2001 sticker on the boat and in clear sight. Any boat found on the property without the proper sticker will find their boat chained up. To avoid any inconveniences in the summer, take the time now to fill out the proper form for dry sailing.
- All disposable winter tarps are to be disposed of in the large roll-off container located at the entrance of the Club. Do not throw your tarps in the dumpsters located behind the Galley. Remember to dispose of all materials in the appropriate dumpster. Place all recyclables in the container marked "recyclables." The Club will be fined for any items not found in the appropriate container.
- For the convenience of all members please be on time and have the right amount of help required for launch.

- After launch, please police your winter-stored area and clean up all empty paint cans, tarps and maintenance materials. Place all blocking and shims on the pallets located in your area.
- No pets are permitted on the grounds without a leash. Keep your pet from barking at people walking on your dock. Observe the dog walking areas near the front gate. Please police your dog's deposits.
- Tie back all halyards; this is very annoying for someone sleeping nearby.
- Keep your dock boxes back if they restrict the passage of emergency personnel.
- Children under 10 must wear a personal flotation device when on board or near the water. All children must be supervised when in the Clubhouse or near water.

- Don't fish off the catwalks when the boat owner is on board.
- No grills are permitted on the wing docks, D & E Dock, J & K Dock and M & N Dock.
- No bike riding, rollerblading, skateboarding on the wing docks.
- No swimming in the Club basin.
- · No minors at the Bar.
- Keep all children under restraint in the Clubhouse. No running between tables and hallways.
- Do not throw garbage overboard in the Club basin.
- Control your car speed on Club grounds. The speed limit on Club property is 15 miles per hour.
- No parking along the front of the building. This is a fire lane and reserved for emergency vehicles. Handicap spaces are marked in front of the carport.

Hazardous Waste Disposal

GUIDELINES FOR DISPOSING OF CONTROLLED WASTE MATERIALS

Collection points have been set up for your use in disposing of fuel and oil filters, waste oil, paint cans, aerosol cans, small propane cylinders, waste gasoline and batteries. There is a roll top drum cover on the west side of the canoe house across the road. The waste oil room is on the south side of the maintenance building. The collection area for the other items is behind the blue plastic-covered storage structure at the maintenance building.


Do not put any gasoline in the waste oil area.

- · Place gasoline fuel filters to drain on funnel tray on gasoline drum in roll top.
- Used gasoline and diesel fuel pour in red gasoline drum in roll top.
- Place diesel fuel filters to drain on funnel tray on waste oil tank.
- Place oil filters to drain on funnel tray on waste oil tank.
- Leave abandoned paint cans (with lids on) on skid in back of the blue plastic structure.
- · Put only full or partially full aerosol cans in roll-top, open-top drum. Spent aerosols should be put in regular trash.
- Small "Benzoate"-type **propane cylinders** if empty, dispose in trash. If partially full, place in the roll-top.
- · Place batteries on designated skid.

Ask the yard crew if you have a special need. Please help your Club comply with the environmental regulations.

Waste Disposal

This is a reminder to dispose of all your waste in the appropriate container. The recyclable containers are clearly marked and are located throughout the Club. For the benefit of all members and the well being of the Club, don't throw oil, fuel, tires, acid or any other non-desirable items in either the trash or recyclable containers. The Club is held responsible for items thrown into the waste containers and will be fined if these items are found in the containers. Also, the containers are here for the disposal of garbage from the Clubhouse and members' boats. Do not bring your garbage to be disposed of from home. Members seen throwing garbage from their vehicles and believed to be coming from some source other than their boat will be billed for that disposal.

Vice Commodore'Report

Hopefully all slip holders have received their "Slip Holders' Orientation Manual." We tried to put together a manual that would answer most questions involving the slips. I ask that all members read their manual to refresh themselves on our procedures.

In case you have not been following the Bridge and Board reports, I will bring you up to date on some work being done. The Bridge and Board have approved the repair of the breakwall along F-dock. Along with the repairs will be uniform slips with electricity. Also, we will be installing Jet-ski docks in the unused corner formed by F and G dock. There will be nine Jet-ski docks available this year. These are available to any Regular Member, even if you already have a slip. There

will be no points assigned for these docks and the annual charge will be \$486. These will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis, so if you are interested, notify the General Manager Mike Lynch. If these are popular and sell out, there are plans to install nine more in the corner of 5 and D dock.

Most of the slip assignments have been made and we presently have a small waiting list for slips. My only worry at this point is low water. With all the snow, you would think there would be plenty of water, but so far the water level is very low. Hopefully by spring, it will be back up. If the water level fails to come up, we may have to re-assign a few slips to accommodate members.
