Congratulations to all of them and thank you for the years of dedicated service to the membership of the Club.

EYC Safety Committee Boating Tips Spring Checkup for All Boaters

Well, it's nearly opening day! EYC Members are, or will soon be, working on their boats, getting them ready for the boating season. Here's one way to define and organize work when looking over your boat. With a clipboard in hand, first carefully inspect each

exterior area, the foredeck, side decks, boat bottom, keel, prop, motor(s), swim platform/ladder, cockpit, flybridge, deck boxes, lazarettes, console, etc., looking for anything that needs structural or cosmetic repair. Look for dirt, disarray, damage, rust, signs of leaky fittings, etc. Look for things that are out of place or not in place. Check your sails, lines, chains, fenders, anchor, PFDs, flares, signal flags. Inside and outside of the boat – open every compartment (including the engine room), locker, drawer, and hatch, and lift every cushion. Be sure all latches, port closures, deck fittings, staunchens, life lines and wenches are in good repair and secure. Write down what needs to be repaired, replaced or purchased to make

the boat "like new." Check the tool box. The spares kit. Sailors – do you have bolt cutters and a sharp knife on board in a safe and easily accessible place? They may save a life or your boat. Do as much work, minor or major, while your boat is out of the water.

Safe boating also includes a safe dock. Check your dock lines and electrical land line hook-ups . . . be sure you are using marine quality


outlet boxes and cords. Be sure cords or lines do not run across walking surfaces. Is your dock box a "good boater's box" – meaning, is it an appropriate size, good-looking, and in good repair to be in keeping

with the well-groomed and uniform look the Club works at maintaining? Is your dock box in a safe place that does not impede walking traffic, boat docking, or the safe movement of Club maintenance equipment?

After your successful launching, sea-trial the boat, running it for an hour or so. Try everything. Check all the electronics, light bulbs, wipers, switches, water and oil lines, belts, blowers, heads, bilge pump and instruments. When you're done, you'll have a list of what you checked, what needs done and what's "okay." Make those few repairs – and you'll be ready for a trouble-free, safe and fun season. Finally, review

your list, prioritize it, and put it aside to be used the next time you need a personal boat inspection. Each year, your "to-do" list will get shorter because of your attention each preceding year.

Make this year your greatest, safest, boating season yet! Don't forget your courtesy Power Squadron/Coast Guard Auxiliary inspection for PFDs, up-to-date flares, fire extinguishers, etc. Remember – safety is everyone's responsibility and safety first makes for a happy boating season.







HAZARDOUS WASTE DISPOSAL

Guidelines for disposing of controlled waste materials.

Collection points have been set up for your use in disposing of fuel and oil filters, waste oil, paint cans, aerosol cans, small propane cylinders, waste gasoline and batteries. There is a roll-top drum on the hill, south of the Canoe House, across the road. The waste oil room is on the south side of the Maintenance Building. The collection area for the other items is behind the blue plastic-covered storage structure at the Maintenance Building.

Ask the yard crew if you have any questions. Please help your Club comply with the environmental regulations. This area is for EYC boat owners only, not for vendors or home disposal items!

- Do not put any gasoline or gas filters in the waste oil building.
- Place gasoline fuel filters to drain on funnel tray on gasoline drum in roll top.
- Used **gasoline and diesel fuel** pour in red gasoline drum in roll top.
- Place **diesel fuel filters** to drain on funnel tray on waste oil tank.
- Place **oil and oil filters** to drain on funnel tray on waste oil tank.

- Leave abandoned paint cans (with lids on) on skid in back of the blue plastic structure.
- Put only full or partially full aerosol cans in designated barrel. Spent aerosols should be put in regular trash.
- Small "Benzoate"-type propane cylinders –
 if empty, dispose in trash. If partially full, place
 on designated skid.
- Place batteries on designated skid.

Vice Commodore's

Many thanks to all the members who answered the "ad" in the last issue! We were asking for help in preparing a comprehensive long-term basin study and coming up with feasible solutions. The caliber of those volunteers and their willingness to help is very gratifying. If this bunch doesn't have the ability to get the job done, I don't know who does. We plan to have an organizational meeting in early March to discuss and revise our objectives and make project assignments. We're going to be reviewing the bulkheads, the docks and piers, the utilities, and the best configuration for anticipated boat sizes. We're going to develop a contingency dredging plan that's affordable. We're going to revisit

the use of floating docks, determine the best use for the keg field, and solve the launch ramp problem. Throughout all of this, we will be influenced by the need to adapt to the extremes of changing water levels and by the desire to continually upgrade the facilities to rising standards on the Bayfront.

Work continues on lowering the finger piers on J Dock. All of the piers, with the exception of the outer one, will be fitted with a two-step attachment and a hand railing similar to those installed on the new F Dock piers last year.

At the last Dock Committee meeting, all slips had been assigned. At this point, the consensus of all those agencies making water level predictions is that we will have conditions about the same as last year. No one is betting on improvement which means we will probably see an occasional extreme low. We'll accommodate everyone, but there will be some uncomfortable assignments and no doubt need for further changes. We'll see higher water again, but in the meantime we'll have to endure a few hardships.






- All fees associated with your slip or keg are due by March 31st or before your boat is placed in the slip, whichever is sooner. All slips not paid for by the March 31st due date will be reassigned. For the convenience of your fellow members, if you sold your boat or have decided that you do not require a slip this year, please inform the General Manager as soon as possible.
- All members who have not filed a slip application for a dry sail boat must do so before bringing your boat on the property. Place your 2002 sticker on the boat and in clear sight. Any boat found on the property without the proper sticker will be chained. To avoid any inconveniences in the summer, take the time now to fill out the proper form for dry sailing.
- If you intend on doing any spray painting or heavy sanding, you must contact the Dockmaster. Depending on your location, you will have to be moved to a designated area for that work. This is to eliminate any problems with overspray or dust on the boats stored near yours. For the courtesy of your fellow members, please be aware of wind speed and direction when painting and sanding.

- All disposable winter tarps are to be disposed of in the large roll-off container located at the entrance of the Club. Do not throw your tarps in the dumpsters located behind the Galley. Remember to dispose of all materials in the appropriate dumpsters. All recyclables go in the container marked "Recycles." The Club will be fined for any items not found in the appropriate container.
- For the convenience of all members, please be on time and have the right amount of help required for launch.
- For all new slip holders: contact the Club office to schedule your launch date. Plan early if you would like to be in the water by mid-May. All dates and times two weeks before Memorial Day go fast. Remember to have your 2002 sticker on the boat at the time of launch. For your convenience, launch times have been extended to 6:00 pm on certain days of the week.
- After launch, please police your winterstored area and clean up all empty paint cans, tarps and maintenance materials. Place all blocking and shims on the pallets located in your area.

 Safety Equipment! Please familiarize yourself where the locations of the lifesaving throw rings are. Also, please acquaint yourself to what docks the emergency ladders are located on. These docks have and "E" in a red square on the dock.

more reminders

- Children under 10 must wear a personal flotation device when on board or near the water. All children must be supervised when in the Clubhouse or near water.
- Control your car speed on Club grounds. The speed limit on Club property is 15 miles per hour.
- No pets on the grounds without a leash. Keep your pet from barking at people walking on your dock. Observe the dog-walking areas near the front gate. Please police your dog's deposits.
- Tie back all halyards; this is very annoying for someone sleeping nearby.
- Keep your dock boxes back if they restrict the passage of emergency personnel.
- Don't fish off the catwalks when the boat owner is on board.
- No grills on the wing docks, D & E Dock, J & K Dock and M & N Dock.
- No bike riding, rollerblading, skateboarding on the wing docks.
- No swimming in the Club basin.
- No minors at the Bar.
- Keep all children under restraint in the Clubhouse. No running between tables and hallways.
- Do not throw garbage overboard in the Club basin.
- No parking along the front of the building. This is a fire lane and reserved for emergency vehicles. Handicap spaces are marked in front of the carport.
