#### CANDIDATE FOR REAR COMMODORE


#### RICHARD VICARY, JR.

## Proposed Change to Junior a

In a prior article we talked about a proposed change to the Dues and Initiation Fees for members ages 16 to 35. Many clubs today, including EYC, are finding it difficult to attract members, especially those under 35. It's easy to understand that younger people have less money to spend and are less likely to join a club whose initiation fees are \$4,000 (\$4,250 next year). They face the challenges of college loans, job location, relocation and starting a family. In the last three years only 13 of the 122 new members were between 25-35 years of age.

We believe this proposed plan, that offers Dues and Initiation Fee schedules on a graduated basis related to their age, will encourage younger people to join and will foster a long term relationship with the Club that was a common place a few decades ago:

UNIVERSAL INITIATION FEE	UNIVERSAL DUES FEE
Ages 16-20 No Fee \$0.0	Ages 16-20 (\$65.00) 10% of Reg. Dues
Ages 21-25 10% \$400	Ages 21-25 (\$162.50) 25% of Reg. Dues
Ages 26-30 25% \$1,000	Ages 26-30 (\$325.00) 50% of Reg. Dues
Ages 31-34 50% \$2,000	Ages 31-34 (\$487.50) 75% of Reg. Dues
Age 35 100% \$4,000	Ages 35 (\$650.00) 100% of Reg. Dues

Members' children ages 16 through 34 would join as Jr. Family members, receive a 1/2 point per year and automatically be transferred to Regular in the year of their  $35^{\text{th}}$  birthday. They may

request transfer to Associate if desired.

Others, age 16 to 34 not children of members, would join as Junior members, would automatically be transferred to Associate (with ability to *request* transfer to Regular) in the year of their 35<sup>th</sup> birthday and *would not* accumulate points.

The initiation fee is payable upon joining. While no credit is given for dues paid, the proposed reduced Initiation Fees schedule insures that *no one would pay more than they would have under the existing schedules* as the examples show:

Examples are for joining in 2003 and *maintaining membership class* through age 34 – Full Initiation Fee \$4,250, Regular Dues \$650, Associate Dues \$500.


